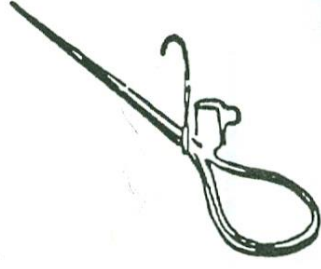
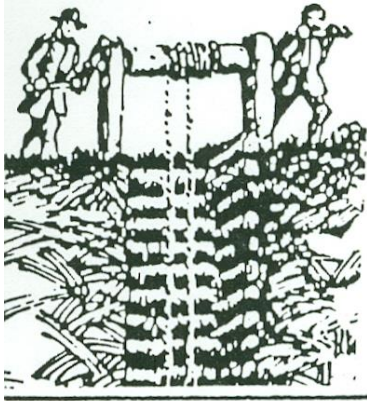


Concentration

Cut out the pictures and the words and glue onto cardstock or heavier paper so the cards will last longer. Mix them up and lay out face-side down. Turn over two. If they match, you can take another turn. If they don't match, turn them down again, and it's the next person's turn. Whoever ends up with the most pairs, wins.

You can probably figure out which picture matches with its name. Some trickier ones are the mine lights. First the miners used candles and the holder was made to be stuck into the wall, carried by hand, or hung on your hat. That's called the stickin' or sticking tommy. Later the miners used a tin lamp that looked like a coffee pot. The wick came out the spout, and the body was filled with grease or a waxy substance. That's the sunshine lamp. In the 20th century miners started to use the carbide lamp. Water dripped on the carbide in the lower half of the lamp. This started a chemical reaction that formed a burnable gas.
